immediate bedfellows but visionary director Ang Lee draws these two opposite ends of the spectrum of life skilfully together.

Billy Lynn's Long Halftime Walk is Lee's latest offering.

The movie starring relative newcomer Joe Alwyn as the eponymous hero is rooted firmly in the American dream.

Baseball, cheerleaders, Beyoncé (when she was still a child of destiny - pun must have been intended) feature, as well as that most American of institutions the military.

Billy finds himself in the midst of heated hand-to-hand battle in Iraq while his superior lies dying nearby.

He emerges victorious only to find his colleague dead.

The eternal question of all conflicts: What's it all for? hangs powerfully in the acrid, sulphurous air.

Yet sergeant Shroom's (Van Diesel) words reverberate in Billy's head. An unlikely fan of Hindu philosophy Shroom once told him: "The bullet that's gonna kill you has already been fired."

And it helps him cope.

Along the way Lee takes us through a bizarre and prolonged portrayal of war as showbiz and killing as a sexy turn on. He also serves up a homo-erotic vision of a group of bored circle-jerking soldiers and phone sex with your lover.

Coming in the wake of the likes of Brokeback Mountain and The Life of Pi this is Lee once again at his simultaneously superficial and profound, inimitable best.

Vegan murders journalist! - Don't worry it's not real ...


YOU MAY not think a vegetarian author would have violence on his mind!
